Wildlife Management Advisory Council (NWT)

Community engagement tour has been completed. There were some comments about the potential listing of Dolphin and Union Caribou, but nothing substantial that could alter the proposed listing. WMAC (NWT) meets September 14-16, 2014. Council will review the results of consultation and will draft a resolution at that point.

Government of the Northwest Territories

The public comment period started on July 9, 2014 and will close on September 8, 2014. It invited input from the public on the proposed listing of both Dolphin and Union Caribou and Northern Leopard Frog through advertisements on the species at risk website, the newspaper, green screens and email distribution. Not a lot of response to date. A few questions were received with respect to the potential listing of Dolphin and Union Caribou, but these questions were related to jurisdiction and management, and have little bearing on the potential listing.

Regarding the completion of section 35 consultation on potential adverse effects of the listing on Aboriginal or treaty rights, official consultation letters were sent to organizations with asserted or established rights within the NWT range of these species were sent. Comments were due on September 2, 2014; however, no input was received. Reminders were sent to these same organizations and they will be provided with an additional week to submit comments.

The potential listing of Dolphin and Union Caribou and Northern Leopard Frog was also provided to the Interdepartmental Species at Risk Committee (InterSARC), which is composed of representatives from all GNWT departments that may have an interest in species at risk. No feedback has been received to date from InterSARC members.

If comments affecting the potential listing of Dolphin and Union Caribou do arrive, the GNWT will provide them to WMAC (NWT) to help inform their council discussions.

A2014090303: Secretariat to draft consensus agreements for the listing of Dolphin and Union Caribou and Northern Leopard Frog and circulate to Management Authorities (WMAC (NWT) and GNWT) prior to the November 7, 2014 conference call.

GNWT update re: NWT Polar Bear Management Plan

A conference call with Yukon Territorial Government (YTG) representatives was held on September 2, 2014. The YTG had provided comments on the Inuvialuit Settlement Region's Polar Bear Management Plan and this conference call was to discuss the nature of their involvement and to identify points of contact in their organization.

Drafts of the management plan and requests for input should come from the GNWT (Environment and Natural Resources) to the YTG. The YTG is interested in receiving things in a timely manner so that they have the same information available to them as everyone else does. More generally, when distributing drafts, the most efficient way is to send them directly to the four organizations (GNWT, YTG, WMAC (NWT) and WMAC (NS)). This hasn't always been done in the past, but will ensure that everyone's getting materials at the same time.

WMAC (NWT) representatives at this meeting will take this message back to the Council and advise the GNWT if there are any concerns with this approach.
